

Notification of Rights Under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act

Strong House Adult Day Center operates its programs and services in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act. Strong House Adult Day Center and its parent organization VNA Community Healthcare & Hospice are committed to ensuring that no person is excluded from participation, denied benefits, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity, on the basis of race, color, national origin and other nondiscrimination directives.

Strong House Adult Day Center, as a recipient of federal financial assistance, will ensure full compliance with the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended and related statutes and regulations in all its programs and activities.

Any person who believes that he or she has been subjected to discrimination or retaliation based on their race, color, or national origin may file a Title VI complaint. Complaints may be filed directly to Strong House, ConnDOT or to the Federal Funding agency. Complaints must be filed in writing and signed by the complainant or a representative and should include the complainants name, address, and telephone number or other means by which the complainant can be contacted. Complaints must be filed within 180 days of the date of the alleged discriminatory act.
