Each are affected differently by the disease so caregivers are faced with a variety of differing symptoms. Alzheimer's has no current cure, but treatments for symptoms are available and research continues. Although current treatments cannot stop it from progressing, they can temporarily slow the worsening of dementia symptoms and improve quality of life for those with Alzheimer's and their caregivers. 

Our Person of the Month recently celebrated his 90th birthday! Fred Farnsworth of Guilford has lived and enjoyed water views, boating, fishing and bird watching since he moved to his beach location after his retirement at 70 years of age.



His earlier years were spent in Hamden, CT. Back in 1945, Fred joined the Navy and served on the USS Fall River during WWII. Upon Fred's return, he attended University of CT where he met his wife, Grace. He graduated among the Class of '51 with a degree in Business Administration. After graduation, Fred joined the family elevator business, Eastern Elevator Company, that was started by his grandfather, Frederick Benjamin Farnsworth in 1895 and continued to work there for many years.

Fred is Chairman Emeritus of the Faulkner Island Light Brigade and serves on the Board of Directors for the Community Investment Corporation, a small business loan organization for start-up companies. He is also a past president of the New Haven Kiwanis Club.

Weekends are often spent visiting elevator work job sites with his son, Paul and his family in North Branford. After 59 years of marriage to his wife, Grace passed in 2010 after a brief illness.
